

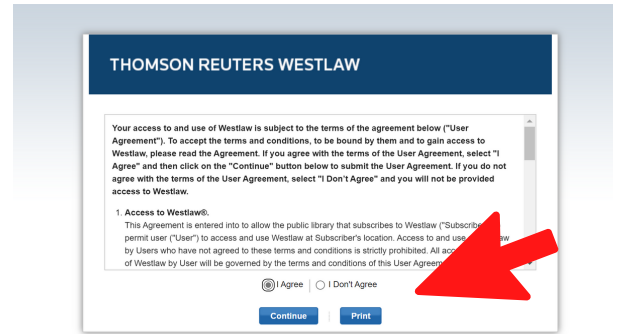
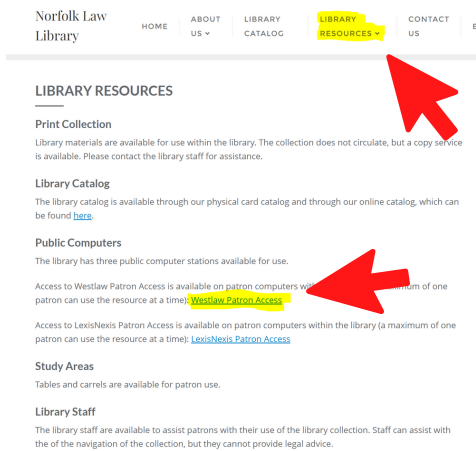
# NORFOLK LAW LIBRARY GETTING STARTED ON WESTLAW

Then click the Westlaw Patron Access hyperlink

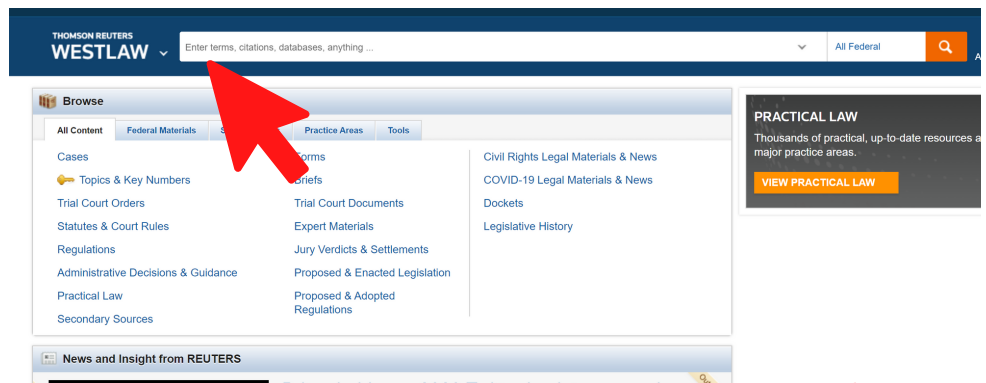


## NEXT...

Review the terms, select I Agree and then click Continue if you agree

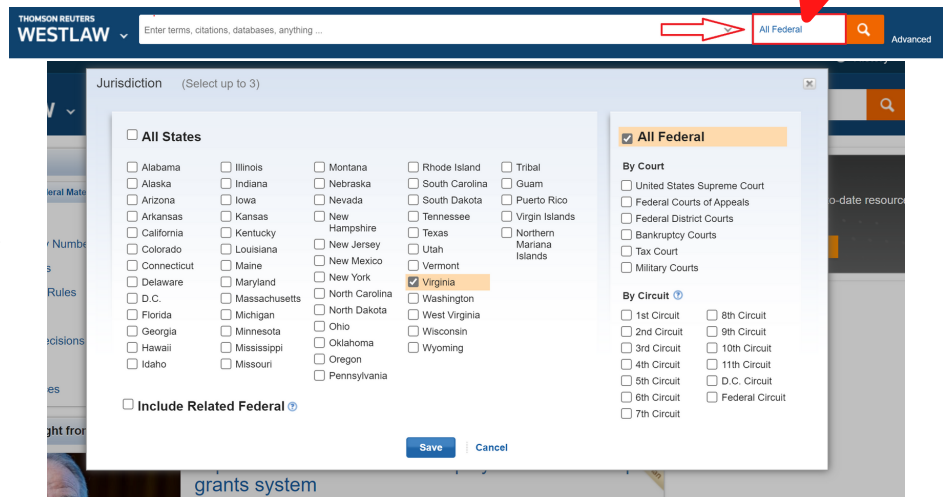
## ENTER A SEARCH

Use the rectangular search bar at the top of the page to type in a specific citation to a law or a case or try typing in keywords on your topic.



## JURISDICTION

Before moving on with the search, select the jurisdiction button if you want to include Virginia or other State materials in your search.



## FILTER

If you need to narrow down the search results, try using the filters on the left side of the page.

Filters will allow you to narrow the results in a variety of ways such as by document type, jurisdiction, date, topic, etc.
